2024 was an outstanding growth year for our Plainfield Youth Assistance Program Advisory Board. We challenged ourselves to our first major inaugural fundraiser event “Performances for A Purpose” which raised \$61,313. For a very young board, I am proud of what they accomplished. Overall, this year **we raise \$115,465** which supports programming for our students. Our 2nd Annual PFP will occur on June 14th, 2025, at Hendricks Live.

This year we **served 255 students** compared to 222 in 2023. Our numbers continue to hold steady. I would like to thank our staff, all the volunteers, mentors, tutors, donors and board members for a very successful 2024. Also, a special thank you to the Plainfield Town Council for their continued financial assistance, which has supported staff salaries. Thank you to the Plainfield School Corporation for their constant support working with our staff to serve their students. Our success is determined by the success of the students and without everyone’s effort this would never have been possible. This program takes the entire community to be successful and the people of Plainfield always step up every year to make it happen.

A special thank you to Judge Ryan Tanselle, for his leadership the past two years. Judge Tanselle was appointed by Governor Holcomb to replace Judge Love when she stepped down due to illness. Judge Tanselle played a big role in growing the Hendricks County Youth Assistance Program into the Avon Community.

In my last meeting with Judge Karen Love, as I walked her to her car, (May 25th, 2022) she stated, “Hendricks County needs this program, and the court system needs this program”. She made me promise that I would make sure this program becomes the Hendricks County Youth Assistance Program. This has been the goal of everyone involved from the beginning and this year Avon School Corporation and Avon Town Council started their Avon Youth Assistance Program.

Judge Love knew what would be good for the youth of our county and loved what she did within the court system. I would like to ask all our supporters to help make Judge Love’s request come true.

Mission

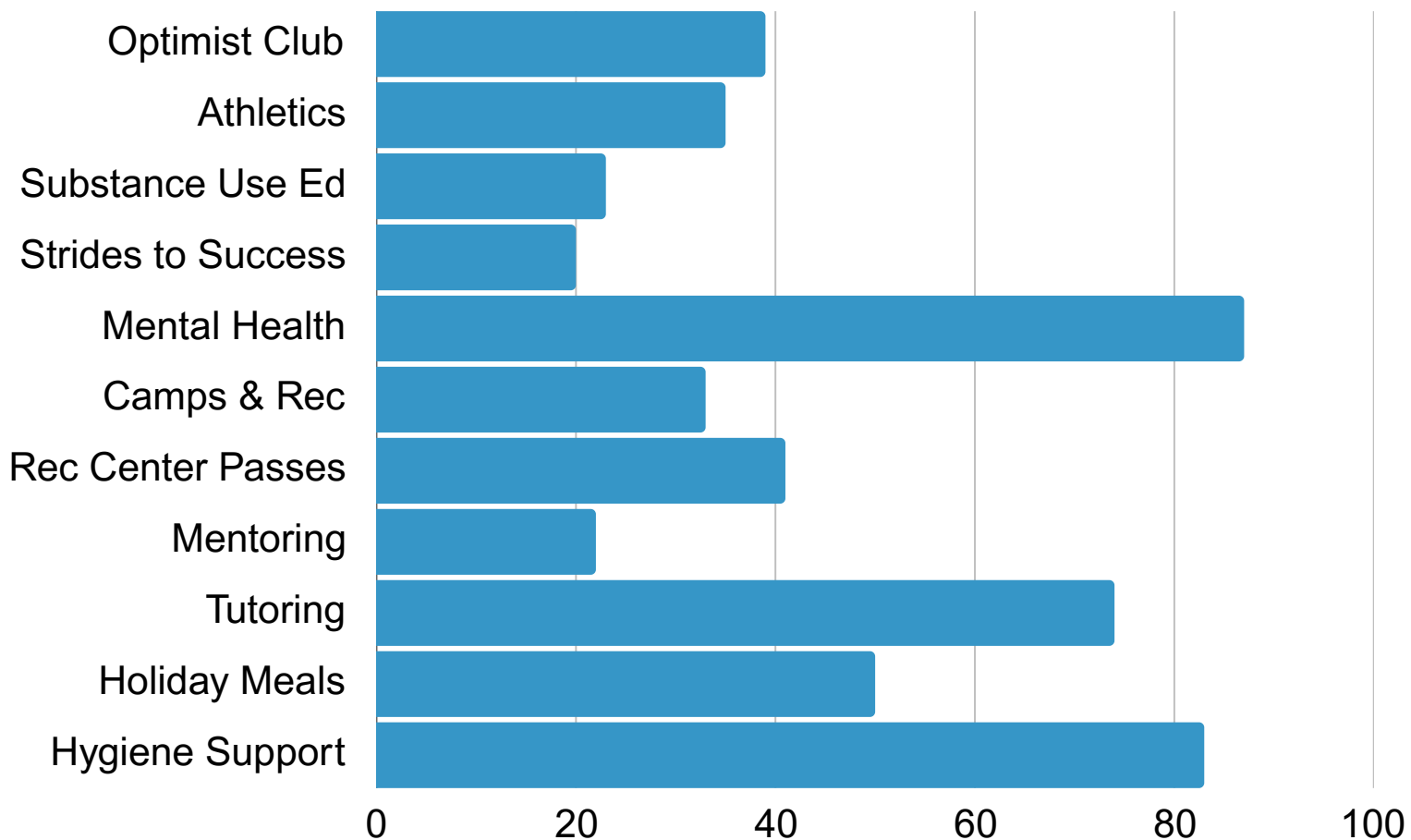

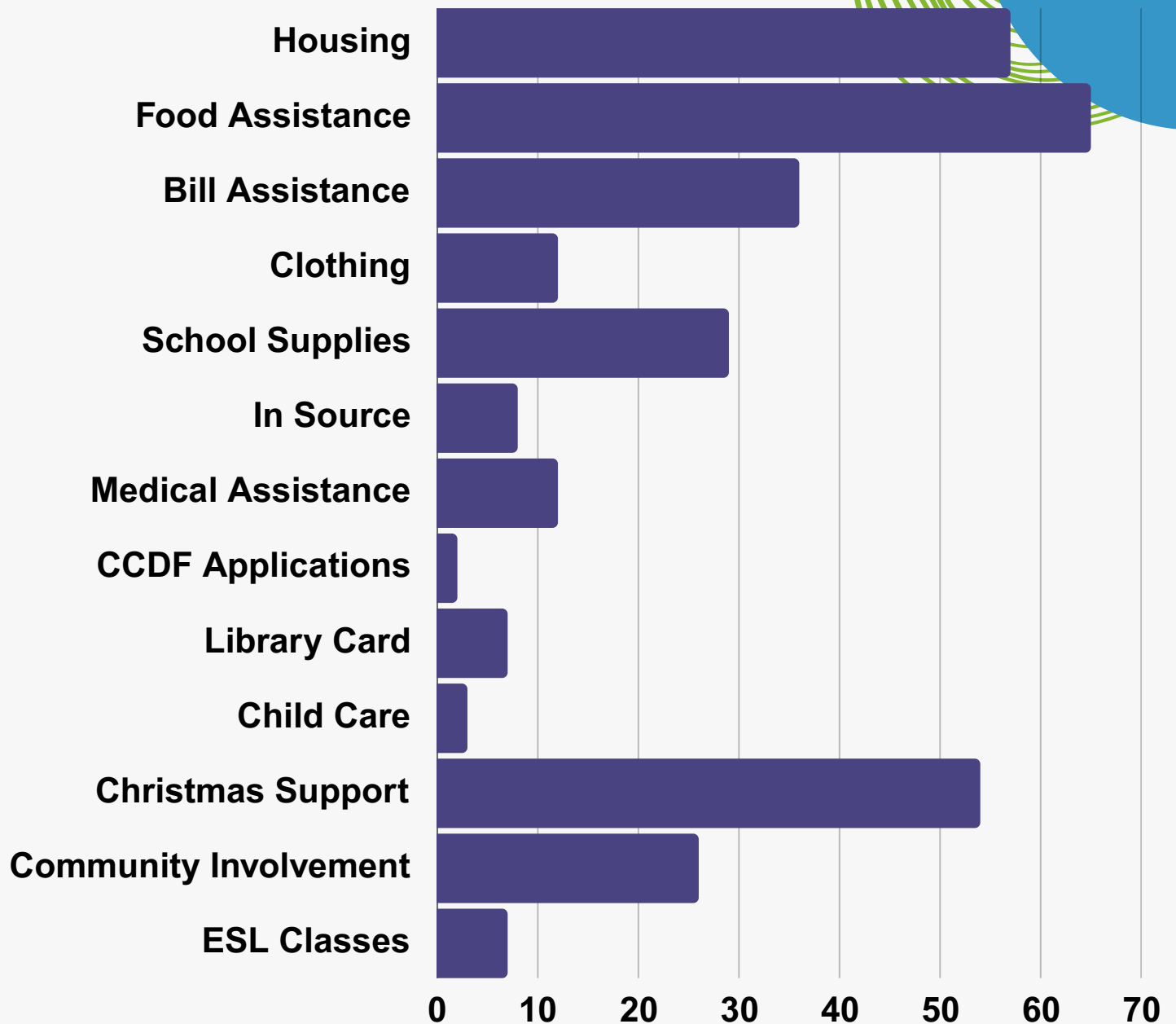

Impact

"One of my kiddo clients was coming for ADHD and anxiety. His ADHD was greatly affecting him in school, so he struggled to complete assignments. He didn't have high self-esteem, so would get discouraged and give up. Through therapy, this client was able to improve his self-confidence and self-talk, and successfully completed his school year on a good note. He had also recently experienced much grief and felt a lot of sadness and fear surrounding death. This client built a sand tray about his fear of death, and through processing, gained a different perspective about death. He was comforted to know God makes all the plans and He already knows when we will die - it's written into our stories before we are born. After this sand tray session, the client did not report any more fear of death, and his mom agreed saying he hadn't shown any anxieties surrounding death."- Care To Change Therapist

"PYAP was brought to my attention by my son's school. He was having some behavioral problems. Around this time I was as well having some work and mental issues. Met with Brandi from the program and she has been very helpful since day one. Giving me resources to help my son with his mental health and anything else she thinks would help. Very helpful received a Halloween costume that I thought I wasn't able to buy due to low funds. Sending me many of things that have taking a lot of stress especially around these trying holidays. 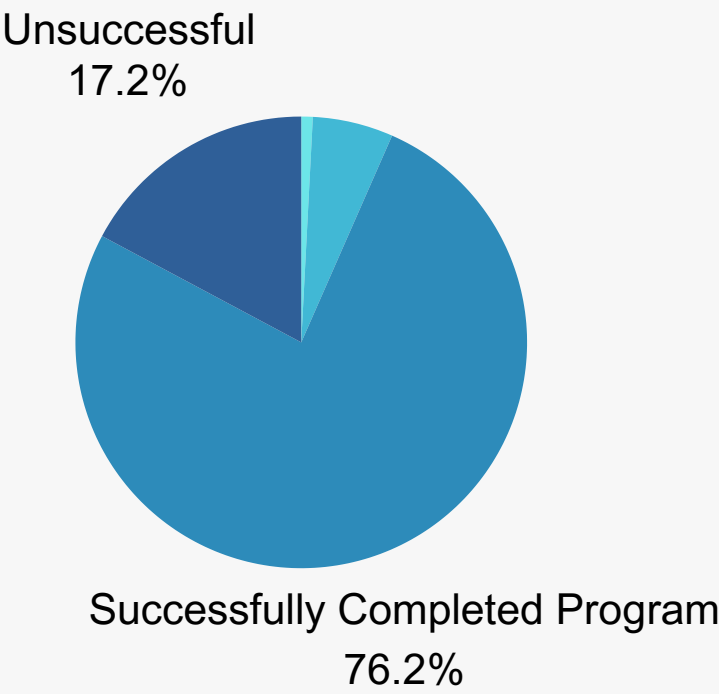




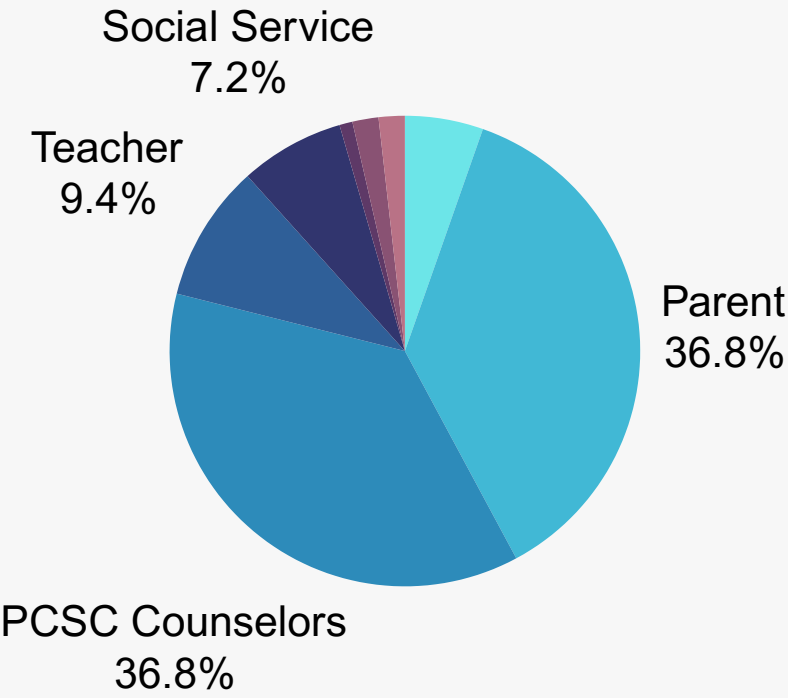
Ages of Students Served

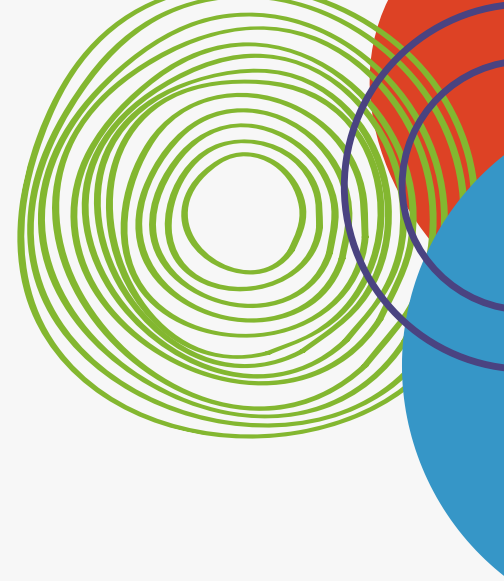
